EBRWF adopted a Resolution to oppose this measure, as it would shut down all oil and gas activity in the county, not just expansion, and cause the loss of some 200-250 head-of-family jobs. Lorie also gave an update on the upcoming Morro Bay Prop 218 vote for water/sewer rate increases.
