Fall Board of Directors Meeting “*Harvest for The Future*” was the theme for our September meeting in Bakersfield! It was a busy, energizing weekend, starting with Friday afternoon workshops, Leadership & Membership Promotion, followed by a presentation by EIPCa, Election Integrity Project, California. During the first workshop, members were encouraged to share ideas for promoting membership and to talk about initiatives undertaken. EIPCa, Election Integrity Project California co-founders Linda Paine and Ruth Weiss presented recent findings uncovered during the June Primary. All CFRW members are encouraged to train with EIPCa and be active in “Keeping Our Republic!”

Saturday’s schedule began at 9:00 am with local high school JrROTC color guard presenting the Colors and a welcome by State Senator Jean Fuller, who represents the Bakersfield area. The morning business session included presenting the Club Charter and welcoming a new Club, Westlake Valley RWF. From the credentials report there were a total of 138 members and guests present from 57 clubs.

The luncheon keynote address was given by John Sullivan, who talked about the upcoming release of a documentary film on Kermit Gosnell, also known as the most prolific abortion doctor in our nation’s history. The film is billed as the story of America’s biggest serial killer, and rightly so. Waiving his right to appeal in 2013, Kermit Gosnell was sentenced to life in prison without parole instead of receiving the death penalty. **Synopsis:** The film is the shocking true story of the investigation and trial of Dr. Kermit Gosnell – his 30-year killing spree and the political and media establishment that tried to cover it up. Originally investigated for illegal prescription drug sales, a raid by DEA, FBI, & local law enforcement revealed crimes they could not have expected within the clinic! Based on the NY Times Bestseller – *Gosnell: The Untold Story of America’s Most Prolific Serial Killer*.

Attendees were also treated to remarks from Greg Conlon, Republican candidate for State Treasurer, and to a dynamic, inspiring, energetic speech from John Cox: **Help is on the way!** Carl DeMaio also gave an update on the YES ON 6 campaign, repealing the gas tax, and a rousing call for all of us to get involved. Finally, we recessed to attend a street rally in front of our hotel. We brought our campaign signs and were filed and interviewed by local news stations.

The evening’s keynote speaker was Ben Bergquam, Co-founder of the Fight Sanctuary State Initiative and host of Frontline America. He described how his activism began, emphasizing the need and responsibility we must get involved at any level we can, whether it is from home making calls on behalf of candidates, doing research for a club’s projects/initiatives, or contacting elected officials, to participating in precinct walking for candidates to rallies on the streets. Ben’s overarching theme was hopeful.

Sunday, we ended the conference with our RNC California National Committeeman, Shawn Steel, addressing the attendees. He talked about John Cox’s rise in the polls, President Trump’s increasing popularity, and the changing tide. Shawn, like all the other speakers, emphasized our 24/7 mission between now and November 6<sup>th</sup>...**Get out the vote!**
