

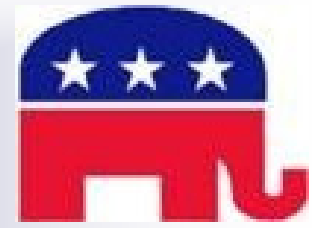

ARTICLE VII —ETHICS

Section 1. Candidate Endorsements

(a) Pursuant to ARTICLE V, Section 1a, of CFRW Bylaws, the Central Division President, Vice- Presidents, the Regional Directors, and Local Club Presidents shall not endorse a candidate prior to any election, when there is more than one Republican candidate for the same office. If any of the Aforementioned desire to do so, she must resign her office. The only exception permitted is when her husband or a member of her immediate family (i.e. child or parent) is a candidate for office in any election so long as she does not permit the Federation's name to be used, and she does not actively campaign by using her office and the Federation as endorsements.

(b) Pursuant to ARTICLE V, Section 1b, of CFRW Bylaws, The NAME OF THE LOCAL CLUB shall not be used by a member or an associate member in supporting a candidate during any campaign. The only EXCEPTION PERMITTED SHALL BE IF A LOCAL CLUB'S active members vote to endorse a member of their club for a specific office when there is more than one Republican candidate running for the same office and provided the other Republican candidates for that position have been given an opportunity to be heard. Such vote shall require that all active members receive ten days previous notice including date, time and place, and the vote shall be by ballot. A three-fourths vote shall be required to endorse.

(c) Pursuant to ARTICLE V, Section 1c. of CFRW Bylaws, for a Special election only, if a Local Club wishes to vote to endorse a Federated Active Member, even if more than one Republican is running for the office, provided the other Republican candidates for that position have been given the opportunity to be heard, such vote shall require that all regular members receive ten days previous notice, including date, time and place, and the vote shall be by ballot. A three-fourths vote shall be required to endorse.

(d) Pursuant to ARTICLE V, Section 1d, of the CFRW Bylaws, candidate endorsement limitations shall not preclude any member from serving as a delegate to the Republican National Convention.

Section 2. Ethics

(a) It shall be considered a breach of ethics for a member to speak disparagingly in public of a Republican candidate.

(b) It shall be considered a breach of ethics for a member to promote a candidate of another party in public or print in a partisan or nonpartisan election when a Republican is running. The member may be suspended for the remainder of the fiscal year.

Section 3. Only registered Republicans shall be invited to speak at any meeting.

Section 4. All literature, petitions, materials or announcements of any description shall first be submitted to the President or the Executive Committee for approval before being circulated or distributed at any Federation meeting.
