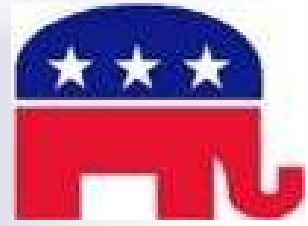

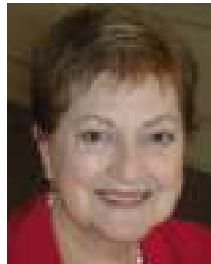

Gasoline Taxes for the State of California are Going Up

This is true.

They could jump anywhere from 15 to 70 cents a gallon. If they come, they will come from the state's Cap and Trade program. This is **AB32** which was passed in 2006. It is designed to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and starting January 1st, "transportation fuel suppliers" will start paying into the program and you can expect them to pass it along to the taxpayer. California has the highest gasoline taxes in the Nation. Government now collects between 71 and 74 cents in taxes per gallon. Cap and Trade people believe it could add an additional 15-70 cents per gallon.

Unlike regular tax revenue that goes to Sacramento, where lawmakers allocate funding in open public debate, cap and trade revenue bypasses that traditional legislative process. Instead, under the Global Warming Solutions Act, (AB32), billions of dollars will go to the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund. Two non-elected members of the Air Resources Board, who are appointed by the Governor and approved by the state senate, will help over-see the funds.

From this fund already, the state has borrowed 500 billion dollars to help balance the state budget. They have promised to pay it back. And the Governor recently siphoned off \$250 million from the fund to help pay for the state's largely unfunded \$68 billion bullet train.

There is a lot more about this on the California State website. Just be aware and when the time comes, we ALL need to call Sacramento and complain....Loudly!
