Dan Dow, SLO County District Attorney

District Attorney Dan Dow is the elected public prosecutor for the County of San Luis Obispo, and he leads an office staff of 100 employees. The District Attorney has the mandated responsibility to investigate, evaluate, and prosecute criminal violations committed with the county, and to advise the Grand Jury.

In addition to all his other duties and responsibilities, Mr. Dow is the Chairman of the Human Trafficking Initiative in San Luis Obispo County, and he will be addressing Human Trafficking in his remarks. This should be an interesting and informative presentation. Please attend the luncheon if you can, and let's give Mr. Dow a warm welcome.

At our June Luncheon Meeting, Rebecca Dulitz from Morro Bay High School was our speaker. She is a Junior and is the Founder and President of the Conservative Club at Morro Bay High School. In addition, she is active in FFA, raising cattle to show at the County Fair; she is a SCUBA diver, and active in water rescue work.

Rebecca related many of her experiences being a conservative at her school, from being harassed to being suspended for speaking her mind, and sometimes for just making comments or asking a question. Also, at our June meeting, Lorie Noble and Sandi Tannler presented a power point presentation about the work of the Election Integrity Project – CA.

The EIP, among other things, trains volunteers to become poll watchers to ensure a fair ballot process. If you are interested in becoming a poll watcher, please visit the EIP website and register. You will receive updates from the EIP, as well as information about when and where the training sessions will be held. They are usually scheduled shortly before an election. On the website you can also ask questions pertinent to your county and receive an answer from one of the volunteers who monitor the site. PROTECT YOUR VOTE:

DON'T vote provisionally if you don't have to.

DON'T vote by mail if you don't have to.

If you do vote by mail:

- visit your Registrar's office and ask to see the signature on file for you—if it has changed significantly, submit an updated signature
- know the ballot mailing date
- if your ballot does not arrive within a few days, call your Registrar's office, report your ballot lost and request a new one
- do NOT submit your ballot by mail
 - use a secure county drop box
 - take your ballot to the Registrar's office
 - drop your ballot at any polling place on Election Day
 - BEST: surrender your ballot at your own polling place (if you have one) on Election Day and vote with a poll ballot

What happens at State Convention?

Each Club President is a delegate with a vote at Convention; California has 143 Clubs. In addition, each Club receives 1 additional delegate for every 25 members. Estero Bay RWF will have 4 delegates, total. Members who are not delegates are welcome to attend, as well, to enjoy the speakers and friendship with Republican Women from across California.

This year at Convention we will vote on Bylaw changes that will ensure a smooth transition to the new Region structure (approved in 2017), as well as the new slate of Officers for CFRW. New this year will be Region caucus where the delegates will meet to nominate and approve a Regional Director.

Estero Bay RWF will be in Region 5, which includes 16 Clubs in the following counties: Ventura, Santa Barbara, San Luis Obispo, Monterey, San Benito, and Santa Cruz.
