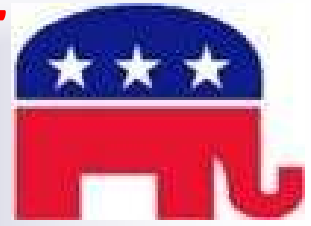

Hillary Clinton may have won the majority of states so far in the 2016 Democratic primary but statistics show these victories are not as impressive as she may think. Compared to 2008, 3 million fewer Democrats have shown up to vote in the election.
