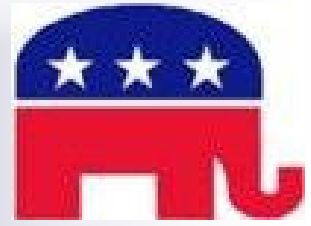

## Major Threats to Proposition 13 and Homeowners



### New Bills Threaten Homeowners and Small Businesses

The new Legislature is dominated by pro-tax politicians. The legislative session has just begun and already the following bills, which undermine the taxpayer protections in Proposition 13, have been introduced. If approved, these bills could cost every property owner thousands of dollars.

#### **Senate Constitutional Amendment 3**

(SCA 3), Mark Leno (D—San Francisco): Lowers the threshold for school district per parcel property taxes from two-thirds to 55%. This is a direct assault on Proposition 13 because it makes it easier to increase property taxes above Proposition 13's one percent cap.

**Senate Constitutional Amendment 4** (SCA 4), Carol Liu (D—La Canada) *and* **Senate Constitutional Amendment 8** (SCA 8), Ellen Corbett (D—San Leandro): Lowers the threshold for the imposition, extension or increase of local transportation special taxes from the Proposition 13-mandated two-thirds vote to 55%. Most transportation special tax increases consist of very regressive sales tax hikes. These add to the burden of California taxpayers who already pay the highest state sales tax in the nation.

**Senate Constitutional Amendment 7** (SCA 7), Lois Wolk (D—Davis): Lowers the threshold from two-thirds to 55% in order to approve a bond to fund public library facilities. Lowering the threshold for school facilities to 55% has already resulted in billions of dollars of additional property tax payments that otherwise would not have been approved by voters.

**Senate Constitutional Amendment 9** (SCA 9), Ellen Corbett (D—San Leandro): Lowers the threshold from two-thirds to 55% to increase special taxes to fund community and economic development projects. **Tell your representatives that you oppose these bills that attack your Proposition 13 protections.**

At the June Meeting Voter registration Chairman will be signing up volunteers.

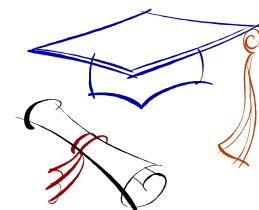
### ANDY VIDAK

# The Hispanic Vote Isn't Why Romney Lost

Now, Byron York in the Washington Examiner: "After six months of mulling over November's election results, many Republicans remain convinced that the party's only path to future victory is to improve the GOP's appeal to Hispanic voters. But how many Hispanic voters do Republicans need to attract before the party can again win the White House? A lot. Start with the 2012 exit polls.

"The New York Times' Nate Silver has created an interactive tool in which one can look at the presidential election results and calculate what would have happened if the racial and ethnic mix of voters had been different. The tool also allows one to project future results based on any number of scenarios in which the country's demographic profile and voting patterns change. In 2012, President Obama famously won 71% of the Hispanic vote to Mitt Romney's 27%."

However, the Hispanic vote was 7% of the electorate. This is not talked about much, but I think it's kind of important. Obama and Romney split 7% of the electorate. Obama got 71% of it; Romney got 27% of it. "If all other factors remained the same, how large percentage of the Hispanic vote would Romney have had to win to capture the White House? What if Romney had won 44% of the Hispanic vote, the high-water mark for Republicans achieved by George W. Bush in 2004?"

No Republican has ever, in a presidential race, gotten more. So plug that number in. What if Romney gets 44% of the Hispanic vote -- which, again, is 7% of the electorate. "As it turns out, if Romney had hit that Bush mark, he still would have lost, with 240 electoral votes to 298 for Obama. But what if Romney had been able to make history and attract 50% of Hispanic voters? What then? He still would have been beaten, 283 electoral votes to 255." Okay, so let's get really big here.

"What if Romney had been able to do something absolutely astonishing for a Republican and win 60% of the Hispanic vote? He would have lost by the same margin, 283 electoral votes to 255." Okay, so let's go all-in! Let's give Romney 70% of the Hispanic vote. It'll never happen. That's what Obama got. Let's give Romney the Obama percentage of the Hispanic vote. Let's give Romney 70%. "Surely that would have meant victory, right? No, it wouldn't. Romney still would have lost, although by the narrowest of electoral margins: 270 to 268.

"(Under that scenario, Romney would have won the popular vote but lost in the Electoral College...) According to the Times' calculator, Romney would have had to win 73% of the Hispanic vote to prevail in 2012." What does this tell you? It tells me that the Hispanic vote's not the problem, and I never have thought it's the problem. You and I know what the Republican problem was in 2012. We just heard it late last week. It was a Pew Center poll. If the "white vote" had shown up in the same percentage and voted for Romney in 2012 as it voted for McCain in 2008, Romney would have won.

Obama got many fewer votes in 2012 than he got in 2008. The difference-maker was, a lot of white voters stayed home. Why?



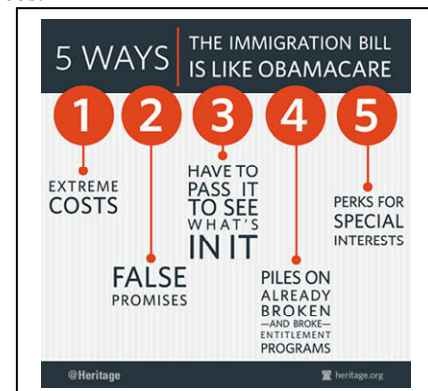
Former South Carolina Republican senator and current Heritage Foundation president Jim DeMint argued that implementing immigration reform as proposed by the so-called "Gang of Eight" would "cost Americans trillions of dollars," citing a soon-to-be released update to the conservative group's 2007 study on the impact of immigration reform

"The study you'll see from Heritage this week presents a staggering cost of another amnesty in our country," DeMint said this morning on "This Week," based on the "detrimental effects long-term" of government benefits that would eventually go to the millions offered a path to citizenship under the reform legislation currently being considered.

"There's no reason we can't begin to fix our immigration system so that we won't make this problem worse. But the bill that's being presented is unfair to those who came here legally. It will cost Americans trillions of dollars. It'll make our unlawful immigration system worse." A 2007 study by Robert Rector, assuming all undocumented immigrants were granted "amnesty," said the cost to the United States of immigration reform would be at least \$2.6 trillion. When asked if the new Heritage estimate would be more than \$2.5 trillion, DeMint responded "much more than that."

The 2007 study is not without its critics, such as Alex Nowrasteh of the Cato Institute, who wrote in April that the study's "flawed methodology produced a grossly exaggerated cost to federal taxpayers of legalizing unauthorized immigrants while undercounting or discounting their positive tax and economic contributions." DeMint dismissed the criticisms, including estimates by the Congressional Budget Office that say immigration reform will increase economic growth. "Well, CBO said Obamacare wouldn't cost us anything. They're basically puppets of the Congress and the assumptions they put in the bill. Heritage is only organization that has done an analysis on the cost," DeMint said. "If you consider all the factors related to the amnesty -- and, believe me, this is comprehensive -- that it will have a negative long-term impact on our gross domestic product," DeMint added. "So we just want Congress, for once, to count the cost of a bill. They're notorious for underestimating the cost and not understanding the consequences."
