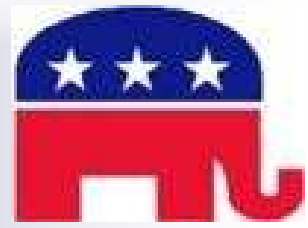

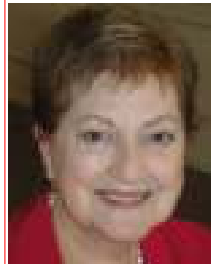

CFRW Board of Directors Meeting and Conference, by Lorie Noble

Our President Sandi and I had the opportunity to attend the CFRW Conference in Bakersfield in October. It was a packed agenda with many workshops and great speakers. We started with a Friday afternoon Club Presidents meeting and a membership recruiting workshop then in the evening we headed to the Buck Owens Crystal Place for a social event for the Ambassadors. Saturday business session opened with guest speakers State Senator Jean Fuller and Assemblywoman Shannon Grove. Then reports from the various board members; for membership, our Central Division is at 93% of last year's total as of September. October is the last membership reporting month, then the numbers are tallied and Clubs and Divisions are rewarded for increasing membership. We heard from the Achievement Awards Chair reminding us that June 1, 2015 is the deadline to submit our awards forms and there are some new achievements where we can gain additional points. Additionally, campaign hours are separate from volunteer hours and using social media or blogging for a campaign also counts!

During lunch our guest speaker was Joseph Brocato (yes that Joe, from San Luis Obispo), Commander of the local chapter of the Military Order of World Wars. He presented a very moving lecture on American Exceptionalism: A Legacy of our Founding Fathers and the American Veteran. His guest was WWII veteran Ben Bellefeuille to whom we presented a flag that was flown over the US Capital.

Saturday afternoon brought three very professional presentations. First, Allison Olson, CFRW Advocate and Clair Plotner, CFRW Legislative Analyst presented the November ballot measures and held questions and answers from the audience. Next Shawn Steel, California RNC National Committeeman (and husband of Michelle Steel, member State Board of Equalization) gave us an outstanding presentation of California political demographics and Asian-American voters in particular. There are a growing number of registered Republican Asian-Americans in Southern California and some pretty savvy young elected Asian-American women in particular! The RNC Convention will be earlier in 2016, June 25 which shortens our primary period. They also voted to reduce the number of Republican candidate debates to 8, down from 23. Our last presenter was Delores Chavez-Harmes, CFRW Latina Membership Outreach Chair and Suzette Martinez, RNC representative for Spanish initiatives for California. This dynamic duo filled us in on what the RNC is doing to get our message out to the Hispanic communities and to support Republicans, Hispanic or not, to win races in these communities.

Our Saturday banquet guest speaker was Congressman Kevin McCarthy!!! They call him "Leader McCarthy" now. After a few antidotes on his current position in Washington, he focused on California and the up coming key races. He is a very busy man, out helping our Republican candidates raise money and he is well aware of the power of CFRW and our members! On the other hand, Neel Kashkari our other speaker was not aware of our Federation until just recently. If he stays in politics he will be sure to reach out for our endorsements!

Sunday brought our final credentials report: 59 clubs represented, 21 Club Presidents, and 188 total members and guests. Another excellent workshop was presented on "How to Woo the Media" by Trish Lester, CFRW Public Relations Chair. We brought some information back with us to help with media packets and some PR ideas. Our final group of speakers were candidates Ron Nehring, Greg Conlon, and Pedro Rios a candidate for Assembly and history teacher.

It was a great weekend networking with Republican women, meeting new friends and visiting with old friends. The next state conference is January 30-31 in Modesto. We will select the CFRW nominating committee and hear from candidates running for various CRP offices who are seeking our endorsement. At his meeting, our President Sandi will be a voting member. All our members are encouraged to attend State CFRW and division (we are in the Central Division) conferences. They are educational, fun, and can recharge you politically. It is a great opportunity to learn about the Federation, its programs and foundation.
