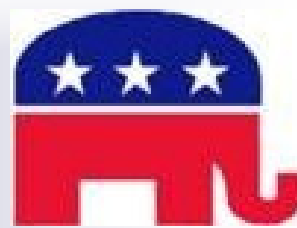

What is a track chair? What makes it different from a regular wheelchair? How can I support the Track Chair Project? The track chair is an all terrain wheelchair which is capable of traveling where a regular wheelchair cannot. It can travel on all types of terrain including on sand, through forests lands and even in shallow waters. The chair is a high-tech marvel that will not roll over and has customized controls for veterans. A track chair provides independence along with physical and emotional healing to a wounded veteran. California Federation of Republican Women (CFRW) is striving to donate a chair and hopefully, more chairs to veterans through the Independence Fund. A track chair costs approximately \$15,000 so CFRW needs all California clubs and their members working together to reach the goal. All donations, big or small, will help in the project's success.
